

APPLICATIONS ARE BEING ACCEPTED TO PENSACOLA CHAPTER OF AMERICAN INNS OF COURT.

The Pensacola Chapter of the American Inns of Court continues its service to the Escambia-Santa Rosa legal community this fall. The purpose of the Inns of Court is to promote civility, integrity, and professionalism in the legal community, while providing continuing legal education and interaction with a diverse group of local attorneys and judges.

The Inn meets the third Thursday of each month from October through May at 5:30 p.m. at the M.C. Blanchard Judicial Center or the Federal Courthouse, depending on whether the judge assigned to the team for the month is a federal or state judge. An informative and entertaining presentation is given by a group of members at each meeting. Each meeting is then followed by a social hour and dinner.

Other than Masters, members remain in the Inn for three years, but can return after a couple of years absence if desired. The Pensacola Inn accepts applications for membership in three categories: Masters, Barristers, and Juniors. Barristers and Juniors are admitted to the Inn for three years on a rotating basis with approximately one third of the members in each category rotating out of the Inn each year. Masters are admitted to the Inn for an indeterminate term and may elect Emeritus Status after five continuous years of participation.

Juniors are attorneys relatively new to the practice of law with experience ranging up to five years. Dues for Juniors are \$150.00 per year. Barristers are attorneys with five to fifteen years experience. Their dues are \$250.00 per year. Masters are attorneys with over fifteen years experience and judges. Their dues are \$295.00 per year. Depending upon the vacancies available, membership may be offered to an attorney in a category other than the one for which they would basically qualify. Dues are expended to pay for membership in the American Inns of Court, for some costs of educational program materials, and for dinner each month. Applications in all categories of membership to the Pensacola Inn are now being accepted for the 2011-2012 year.

Officers of the Pensacola Inn include Dennis Larry, President; Judge M. Casey Rodgers, Immediate Past President; David McGee, Treasurer; Ron Johnson, Counselor and Tiffany H. 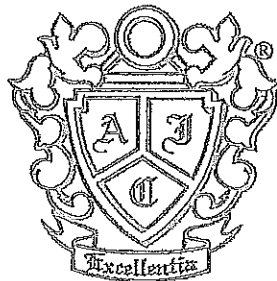
